Build on your existing skills and learn the latest advanced beauty therapy techniques including lash lifting, lash extensions, microdermabrasion, body machinery, facial peels, advanced massage techniques and more. You will also be able to undertake CIDESCO qualifications (optional).

Classes are taught three days a week on campus (one late night per week to be scheduled throughout the year).

Beauty therapy graduates are in demand and you can expect to gain work in a salon or be able to work independently.

The programme includes

Graduates will be able to:

- implement professional standards and expectations relating to advanced beauty services including all relevant health, safety and hygiene obligations.
- undertake an in-depth consultation and build rapport with clients to analyse and evaluate their needs, and develop and manage a treatment plan for advanced beauty services.
- apply knowledge of advanced skin care, body therapy and hair removal services as well as products and related skills, to meet client's needs during and after treatment, in accordance with industry standards and current and emerging trends.
- apply knowledge of relevant aspects of chemistry, physics and biology in an advanced beauty services context to provide effective services and ensure client comfort and safety.

- manage the operation of a small beauty sector business or client base.
- apply knowledge of skin and body diseases and disorders in order to identify symptoms, provide information and advice, and refer clients to health practitioners in accordance with industry standards relating to scope of practice.
- provide nutritional advice which is complementary to advanced beauty services.

To be eligible to sit the CIDESCO Beauty Therapy Diploma, students will be required to complete the qualifying practical and theoretical assessments in the New Zealand Diploma in Beauty Therapy.

To be awarded the CIDESCO Beauty Therapy Diploma for which an additional fee must be paid, students must complete a minimum of 1200 hours of practical and theoretical training at the training provider.

This is to be followed by at least 600 hours of practical work in a beauty salon at the completion of the programme, making a total of at least 1800 hours.

The CIDESCO examination consists of the following elements:

- Practical facial examination
- Body examination
- Waxing examination
- Projects (with case studies) To consist of at least

2500 words but not more than 4000 words on a subject relevant to beauty therapy.

- Theoretical multi-choice examination

In addition to the above, the student also has the option of:

International CIDESCO Post Graduate Electrical Epilation (Electrolysis) Diploma

The CIDESCO Post Graduate Electrical Epilation Diploma is available only to candidates who have taken the CIDESCO Beauty Therapy Diploma.

An additional fee must be paid, students must complete the following elements:

- Practical electrical epilation examination
- Theoretical multi-choice examination
- Case Histories (total 36 treatments)

Programme specific information

Entry Requirements

- New Zealand Certificate in Beauty Therapy (Level 4); or
- Equivalent knowledge, skills, work experience or study.

Any applicants whose first language is not English may be required to provide evidence of an overall IELTS (Academic) band score of 5 (with no score below 5 in speaking, reading, writing and listening) or equivalent.

Class times

Programme is delivered three days per week including one late night per week

Assessments

This programme includes competency-based assignments, theory tests and practical assessments

Work Experience

This programme has no requirement for work experience, but students are recommended to undertake work experience to enhance their formal

learning.
