Build on your Level 3 Hairdressing qualification and become a fully qualified hairdresser! This programme is designed for individuals with existing knowledge of hairstyling, colouring, and basic cutting techniques, who are looking to enhance their skills and expertise to pursue a career as a professional stylist. Upon successful completion, you will possess the knowledge, skills, and attributes needed to deliver a range of integrated fashion services as a professional hairstylist, working effectively under general supervision.

You will learn how to:

- Provide client consultation, diagnosis, care and advice to establish a plan for future hair treatment services and home haircare as a professional hairstylist.
- Apply hairdressing theory and practice to safely and professionally complete a broad range of integrated, current fashion services to meet client requirements, including cutting, styling, colouring, colour correction, and chemical reformation.
- Manage multiple integrated client hairdressing services in a timely manner to support a salon's profitability.

Courses

PERS4201

Professional Stylist Attributes

The aim of this course is to develop the knowledge, skills and attributes to understand the intersection between personal and professional self, and communicate effectively in the hairdressing industry.

PERS4202

Sculpture

The aim of this course is to develop the knowledge, skills and attributes to perform foundation scissor cuts,

razor and clipper services on a diverse range of clients.

PERS4203

The Art of Advanced Hair Design

The aim of this course is to develop the knowledge, skills and attributes to perform advanced hair design using wet and dry styling.

PERS4204

Reformation Designs

The aim of this course is to develop the knowledge, skills and attributes to perform reformation services on a variety of hair types.

PERS4205

Advanced Colour Design

The aim of this course is to develop the knowledge, skills and attributes to make informed decisions and carry out advanced colour and decolouring services.

PERS4206

Fashion Colour and Sculpture

The aim of this course is to develop the knowledge, skills and attributes to perform a range of fashion colouring and cutting.

PERS4207

Advanced Client Journey

The aim of this course is to develop the knowledge, skills and attributes to perform a range of fashion colouring and cutting.

PERS4208

Advanced Grand Finale

The aim of this course is to develop the knowledge, skills, and attributes to synthesise learning to present

avant-garde styles to a professional hairdressing standard.

Programme Specific Information

- Programme duration: 1 year full-time
- Assessment in this programme are achievement-based.

Entry Requirements

General admission

- To be admitted to this programme, applicants must hold one of the following: i. New Zealand Certificate in Hairdressing (Level 3) OR ii. an equivalent qualification

Special admission

- Any ākonga who is 20 years of age or older and has not reached the general admission requirements for their intended programme is eligible for Special Admission. Te Pūkenga works with the ākonga to ensure they are prepared for their intended programme.

Discretionary admission

- Any ākonga who is not yet 20 years of age and has not reached the general admission requirements for their intended programme may be eligible for Discretionary Admission. In assessing whether to grant Discretionary Admission, the delegated authority focuses on the applicant's level of preparedness for their intended programme.

English language requirements

- All applicants (international and domestic) for whom English or te reo Māori is not a first language need to provide evidence that they have the necessary English language proficiency required for the programme.
- International applicants are required to have an IELTS score of 5.5 (general or academic) with no individual band lower than 5 from one test taken in the preceding two years, or an equivalent described

in NZQA Rules.

Additional Course Related Costs

- Stationery - \$100 per year (approx.)
- Uniform (Tunic) - \$75 (approx.) (if student is new to WITT)
- Uniform / Personal presentation - \$200 (approx.) Includes shoes, pants/skirt, makeup and hair products.
- Year 2 Hairdressing Kit- \$400 (approx.)
